In the following pages, we present the monthly dispatch of December 2020. As we are moving towards the year-end, Bhavyata Foundation was able to put a smile on many families who were hit hard due to pandemic. Bhavyata foundation has completed the installation of power supply cable, 10 HP multistage pump, and other equipment materials to cultivate currently 2 acres of land for fodder cultivation in Vakalwadi, Murbad, Maharashtra. Also, ten food kit boxes were distributed in Vakalwadi village, Thane District. We conducted the teachers training session for Balwadi teachers of BMC School with few fun learning techniques.

After completing a submersible pump and other equipment types, the villagers now have access to water to cultivate their land and produce more fodder for Dangi cow. This has resulted in more livelihoods by selling milk and clarified butter. As the world was hit with the pandemic, many families struggled with necessities; Bhavyata foundation is still supplying food kits to such vulnerable families

PROJECT UPDATES



Through the initiative 'Sowing The Seeds', Bhavyata Foundation has started the 'Samvardhan' project in Vakalwadi village located in Murbad, Maharashtra.

The submersible pump has 200liters/min discharge capacity, connecting one outlet to well and other end to 2 acres of fodder cultivation land while providing drinking water throughout the year. We also support them by offering value to traditionally churned ghee (clarified butter) amounting to 12 litres sourced from locally available milk from the village's bovines. Ghee made by the Go-palaks, produced from milk given by the Danggi breed cows that have generated Rs. 12000 worth livelihood. We plan to procure packaging machines, chiller machines, fat checker machines and bilona machines so our Farmers can test and supply milk and dairy derivatives to the assuring quality and safety.

EVENT UPDATES

1. Teachers training program

Bhavyata Foundation had organised a teachers training program for Balwadi teachers from BMC schools adopted by the foundation on 19th December at 12 pm to 3 pm at our Mumbai office. As the pandemic disrupted conventional systems, updating and upgrading our education system for Balwadis was the need of the hour. Our motto was to teach students in such ways that they can find their inner potential. This would help them introduce new ways of contextual learning.

2. Experiential Activities

The training session included the activity of making zeroes on a blank page in a minute. Initially, teachers were asked how many zeros they can make in a minute. Then they were provided with the material for activity. Later the faculty was asked about the number of zeroes made by them versus several zeroes they had thought of making. The results surprised them! The objective was to let teachers know their inner strength.

3. Hunger Free Nation

Under its initiative Hunger-Free Nation, Bhavyata Foundation rescued 50,150 migrant workers, slum dwellers and Rural populace in its largest rescue mission with the advent of Corona Pandemic. Statistics show that India has more people suffering from chronic hunger than any other country. Over 300 million citizens reportedly go to bed without food every night, representing over a third estimated one billion hungry people worldwide. Malnutrition is a massive problem in India. According to the statistic, 38 per cent of Indian children under the age of 5 are malnourished.

4. Distribution of food kits in Vakalwadi

In one such drive, ten grocery kits, loaded with daily essentials, were distributed in the rural village of Vakalwadi, Murbad, Maharashtra in the month of December. The grocery kit box contained jaggery, dal, sugar, oil, soybeans, sweets and Diya. Bhavyata Foundation pledges to help more and more such families a life of food security.

Towards sustainability and improvement of rural livelihoods, Bhavyata Foundation, under its initiative, 'Sowing the Seeds', promotes the 'Samriddhi' campaign to educate and empower farmers for crop productivity with cost-effective natural inputs.

India is a global agricultural powerhouse. It employs approximately 52% of labour. Its contribution to the Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is between 14 % to 15%. India is the world's largest producer of milk, pulses, and spices, and has the world's largest cattle herd (buffaloes) and the most significant area under wheat, rice and cotton. It is the second-largest producer of rice, wheat, cotton, sugarcane, farmed fish, sheep and goat meat, fruit, vegetables and tea. Due to the high growth rates of Industrial and Services

sectors, agriculture's share in India's economy has progressively declined to less than 15%. As the population continues to grow, the workload of farmers also expands. Intervention in areas of high growth commodities, switching to organic products, developing markets, agricultural credit and public expenditures and last but not the least, sustaining the environment and future agricultural productivity is the need of the hour. Samadhan

The program Samadhan, under Hunger Free Nation initiative in partnership with Bhaktivedanta Hospital, aims to conduct a three-month program to impart nutritional diet three times a day and medical supervision and nutrition education to sustain the impact in the villages of Wada and Vikramgad in Palghar district. The intervention will be conducted for 1000 children between 3-5 years old in collaboration with Zilla Parishad, Palghar through 30 Anganwadis. The budget for overall intervention shall be INR 1,25,51,500.

Samvardhan

Under the 'Sowing the Seeds' initiative, through the project Samvardhan, we are creating a sustainable environment for preserving the Dangi breeds in the neighbouring villages of Murbad Taluka of Thane district. We provide farmers with training programs concerning feed and fodder management with new technology. Due to the intervention, we could generate 17 dairy farmers' sustainable livelihood.
