

IN SUMMARY

In June, the Bhavyata Foundation supported feeding for livestock in Igatpuri during the extreme summer, fulfilling our commitment to community welfare. Our "2 Adopt an Anganwadi" projects in Ghatkopar West are completed, creating a learning-enabled environment for underprivileged children. Concurrently, The Foundation continues to impact rural Maharashtra(Palghar District) and urban Mumbai communities in early childhood education, impacting more than 268 children every year through adopted Anganwadis. Furthermore, the foundation actively provides access to quality education for 1460 underprivileged preschool children in BMC schools in Mumbai.

SAMVARDHAN Breed Preservation

In alignment with the sustainability principle, our goal is to guide villages toward economic self-sufficiency through agriculture & cottage industry, providing training in organic farming, breed preservation & the principles of good governance. Bhavyata Foundation is dedicated to reinforcing breed preservation for the betterment of India's dairy industry.



DANGI BREEDS SURVIVAL

SAMVARDHAN, through its 'Sowing the Seeds' initiative, aids gopalaks in preserving indigenous breeds amid challenges posed by limited grazing pastures and inadequate feed resources.



FEED DISTRIBUTION

Amidst the scorching summer heat and scarce resources, we've stepped in to support cows in need by distributing 0.8 tons of dry nutritional fodder.



GOPALAKS SUPPORTED

8 Gopalaks and 280 bovines benefitted, resulting in increased milk production after consuming nutritional feed. The Gopalaks then process the milk into condensed form sold in the marketplace, providing livelihoods.



AARAMBH - Early Childhood Education Program operates 37 classes in 16

Mumbai Public Schools MPS (English medium) and 5 Balwadi classes in 5

Municipal Schools (Marathi Medium). Catering to 1192 students from nearby underprivileged populations since 2018, the program offers free-of-charge instruction in Oral Language Literacy, Numeral Literacy, Fine and Gross Motor Skills, World Around Us, and Hygiene and Nutrition. End-of-year assessments feature playful curiosity sessions and worksheet activities, with an impressive 89% of students transitioning to mainstream education, with most dropouts attributed to changes in residence.


SCHOOL OF SUSTENANCE SHRIVAN WADI PROJECT


The Shrivan Wadi Project, an initiative under the School of Sustenance, aims to enhance the livelihoods of tribal families in Wada Taluk, Palghar District, through sustainable agricultural practices. This project introduces a blend of horticulture and floriculture by providing 300 Jasmine, 60 Mango, and 40 Cashew saplings to be planted on 0.5 acres of the farmers' land.

The introduction of jasmine cultivation is particularly beneficial. After six months, farmers can expect an average daily income of Rs. 300 from jasmine flowers. Over time, this income is projected to increase to Rs. 500-600 per day after four years, providing a significant economic uplift. The inclusion of mango and cashew trees will further diversify income sources and contribute to long-term sustainability. This initiative not only aims to reduce migration but also enhances the economic stability and well-being of the participating families.




SCHOOL OF SUSTENANCE SHRIVAN WADI PROJECT


In Wada Taluk, Palghar District, tribals face economic hardships due to reliance on seasonal farming and low-paying daily wage labor in construction and other industries, leading to meager incomes and forced migration. The Shrivan Wadi project addresses these issues by providing dignified labor, reducing migration, and offering sustainable livelihoods through improved agricultural practices. A June 2024 survey identified key areas and resources for monsoon plantations, with generous donor support aimed at enhancing farmer families' stability and reducing migration.














INTERNS WORK


Interns from UPES, Dehradun, and Atlas University, Mumbai, dedicated their vacation to social causes at Bhavyata Foundation




