PRESCHOOL EDUCATION AT BMC SCHOOLS

We aim to help underprivileged students (from slums and low-income households) for holistic development through playbased preschool education at 21 BMC schools having 2000 children in 37 classes.

DONATION DRIVE

In collaboration with ISACA Mumbai Chapter, we celebrated community day by distributing Bags and stationaries to Anganwadi students. 100 students were supported at 4 Anganwadi centres in Mumbai.









ADOPT AN ANGANWADI

The Government of Maharashtra initiated an Anganwadi adoption program, wherein Bhavyata Foundation signed an MoU with Maharashtra's Women and Child Development (WCD) department. Under this initiative, **40 Anganwadis** in the tribal belts of **Palghar**, **Nashik**, **Gadchiroli**, **Nandurbar** and **Dhule** were adopted.



The focus was on creating a learning-friendly environment through interactive boards, 300 picture cards with vocabulary, life-size imagery of their surroundings, blackboards, crayon sets, worksheets, educational toys, writing pads with slates, and comfortable sitting mats.

MATA AROGYA ABHIYAN - MAA

Pregnant women in underprivileged communities face a lack of proper nutrition, healthcare, and support, which can lead to complications during pregnancy and childbirth.


