At A Glance

On **July 25, Bhavyata Foundation** extended its support to **livestock feeding** in **Igatpuri** during the Monsoon season, reinforcing our commitment to community welfare. Our **"Adopt an Anganwadi" project in Ghatkopar West** has been completed, creating a nurturing, learning-enabled environment for underprivileged children.

Simultaneously, we continue to create meaningful impact in rural Maharashtra (Palghar District) and urban Mumbai by **strengthening early childhood education.** Through our **adopted Anganwadis**, we reach over **300 children annually**. Additionally, the Foundation ensures access to quality preschool education for 1,583 underprivileged children across BMC schools in Mumbai.

Our ongoing **environmental initiative**, **Project Vidyavan**, **in Kalina** has led to the plantation of **over 5,000 native trees**, supporting ecological restoration. We are also proud to witness growing participation from interns across diverse academic fields, who are contributing actively to our grassroots initiatives.

Samavardhan is an initiative focused on the preservation and promotion of indigenous bovine breeds, suited to specific agroclimatic zones, to ensure the sustainability of local agriculture and dairy-based livelihoods.



DANGI BREEDS SURVIVAL

SAMVARDHAN, through its 'Sowing the Seeds' initiative, aids gopalaks in preserving indigenous breeds amid challenges posed by limited grazing pastures and inadequate feed resources.



FEED DISTRIBUTION

Amidst the scorching summer heat and scarce resources, we've stepped in to support cows in need by distributing 0.8 tons of dry nutritional fodder.



GOPALAKS SUPPORTED

10 Gopalaks and 260 bovines benefitted, resulting in increased milk production after consuming nutritional feed. The Gopalaks then process the milk into condensed form sold in the marketplace, providing livelihoods.


OUR GOAL



Farmers Dnyaneshwar Supta, Laxmi Mahakal, Ramchandra Mahakal, and Ravindra Mhaskar practice sustainable farming methods to ensure long-term productivity and environmental balance. On 13 July 2025, they received 300 jasmine saplings, 50 Kesar mango saplings, 30 cashew saplings, 10 guava saplings, and 10 lemon saplings to strengthen their cultivation practices and promote diversified farming for improved livelihoods.











In July, the Miyawaki forest at Kalina University continued to thrive, with saplings now reaching up to 5 feet, some beginning to flower, and displaying strong, disease-free growth. Due to the recent rainfall, the forest looks especially refreshing and vibrant. Out of 5,000 saplings, weed control measures and mulching have proven effective, and the drip irrigation system is functioning well, supporting steady ecological development and biodiversity enhancement.
